<u>Please read this important information about natural</u> gas safety in severe winter weather conditions

Keep natural gas meters, regulators and associated piping from being covered with snow and ice to prevent the following safety hazards:

- Natural gas appliance fresh air intake and exhaust vents can become restricted or blocked, causing incomplete combustion and carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.
- Moisture can prevent natural gas pressure regulators, relief valve vents and other safety equipment from operating properly.
- If natural gas meter and regulator vents are covered with snow and not properly vented, natural gas can accumulate and migrate into nearby buildings.
- Protect natural gas meters, regulators and piping from impact damage from large falling icicles, and when removing snow and ice from rooftops.

Please use a broom, not a shovel, to carefully remove snow from natural gas meters, regulators and associated piping. If your natural gas appliances are not operating properly, please call Mountaineer Gas Company at 1-800-834-2070.

<u>Please read this important information about natural gas</u> safety in severe winter weather conditions

- Pipelines are reliable means of transporting natural gas to our customers.
- Natural gas is flammable and can be explosive if mixed with air near an ignition source. It will displace oxygen in an enclosed space.
- Improper operation of natural gas appliances can cause carbon monoxide poisoning, so have yours inspected by a qualified technician. Consider installing a carbon monoxide detector.
- To prevent pipeline damage:
 - Always call 811 at least 2 business days before digging so that the underground utilities can be marked. Report any damage by calling 811.

- Natural gas leaks can be recognized by:
 - the smell of rotten eggs
 - a roaring or hissing sound
 - o diry blowing into the air
 - bubbles in water or mud
 - dead vegetation in a normally green area
